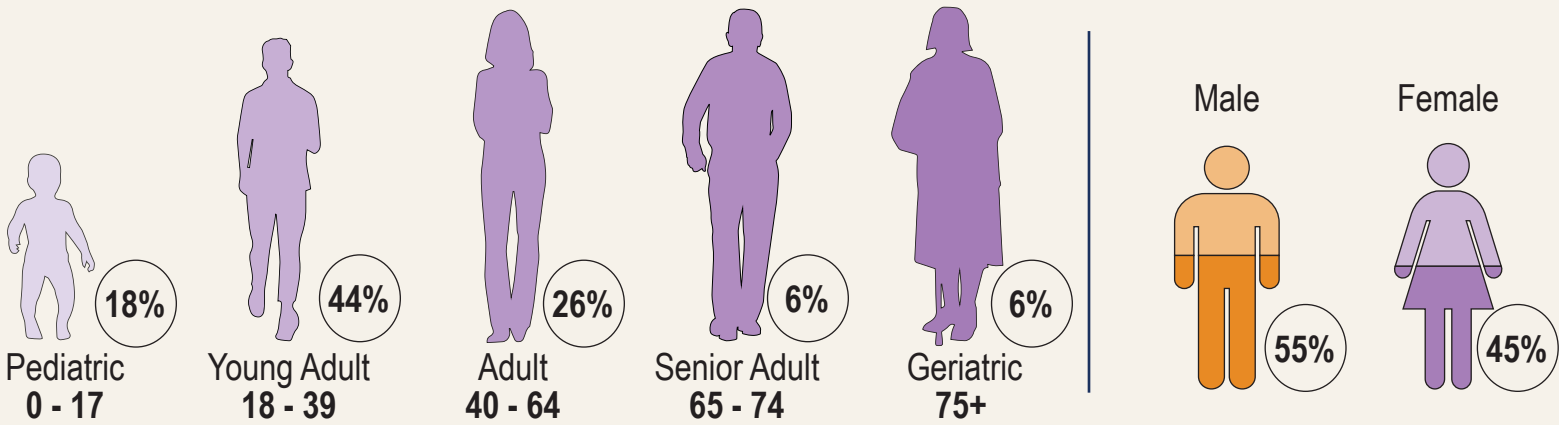

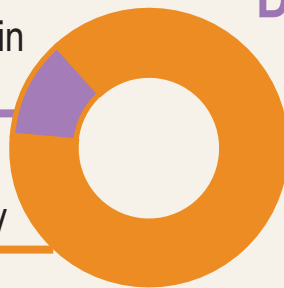
## TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY ACROSS AGE AND SEX
